#### SAIL INSIGNIA

The Board has decided that all skiffs competing in Association events should carry an insignia on their mainsails for the coming season.

The Board does not wish to make this compulsory, however, it will certainly assist us in having our races called from the ferries which follow the 18s and allow spectators to follow the progress of our races.

Those skiffs with sponsor's names etc on their mainsails stand out and can be seen easily from the ferries.

The insignia should be a minimum of 1 m<sup>2</sup> to ensure it is visible from a distance.

This can be done using sticky back which is obtainable from any sailmaker in a number of colours or can be painted to any colour. The sticky back comes in sheets 137 cm wide and is approximately \$16 per metre.

The logo is painted onto the sticky back and then cut out and applied straight onto the mainsail. It is also possible to simply paint directly onto the mainsail. But you should contact a sign writer familiar with sails to get the correct paints.

To avoid duplication of insignia, the association will maintain a register of each skiffs insignia. A form to register your insignia is included with this issue of *Wing Flap*. First in with a design will get preference if there is a clash of designs.

Obviously sponsored skiffs won't need an additional insignia but should advise what will be on the mainsail so that this can be included in the program at the SFS

Your help in this will be greatly appreciated and will help to gain more spectator interest in the fleet

#### ASIAN CHAMPIONSHIP 1997 Should be the year.

The Asian Championships are off - the Hong Kong Association could not arrange things in such a short time span.

#### NOTES FROM THE BOARD!

The second meeting of the Board of Management was held on Thursday 29 June at the SFS and the major points coming out of the Board were as follows:

- O The Medina sponsorship proposal is proceeding difficulty because of some problems experienced with last year's sponsorship also there has been a complete change of staff since last year.
- O Additions to the NSW By-Laws (See story page X).
- O The Board decided not to make sail insignia compulsory, however, it is strongly recommended that all skiffs competing in Association events have a sail insignia (See story page 1)
- O Julian Bethwaite has accepted the recommendations on sail materials etc. which were put together by the NSW Association with the help of Iain MacDiarmid and Frank Bethwaite. These were as follows:
  - That for working sails (jibs and mainsails):
  - a) the specifications be that the sail cloth should be Dacron NYT in with a finished weight in the range of 210-260 gms per m<sup>2</sup>;
  - b) the referred sail cloth be Polyant 225B HTP; and
  - c) that (in Australia) coloured cloth only be permitted in the bottom 900mm, batten pockets and reinforcement sections of jibs and mainsails unless coloured cloth within the weight range specifications is available.

- 2. That for spinnakers:
- a) the specifications be that the sail cloth should be 3/4 oz nylon;
- b) the preferred sail cloth be <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> oz Dynalite a silicon coated nylon;
- c) that an adjustable 2mm Spectra luff line be included in the specifications; and
- d) that all existing spinnakers may be fitted with a 2mm · Spectra adjustable luff line.

Iain MacDiarmid will retro-fit the luff line in your existing spinnaker(s) for only \$20.00 each.

## MARKETING AND PROMOTION WHAT IS OUR FUTURE?

There has been a deal of discussion about the future of the B14 Class, particularly with the introduction of the 49er by Starboard Products.

There has been concern expressed that the B14 will be smothered by the new class and that all our potential buyers will disappear and many of our existing owners will transfer to the new class.

The B14 has never been the subject of a marketing plan or strategy - rather there has been a piecemeal, scattergun approach to the process.

To start the process we need to undertake the basic steps of marketing and complete a marketing audit of our product. Our various market segments need to be identified and the key or high impact segments clearly marked so they can be targeted.

A quick analysis of our current NSW owners identifies two or three "market segments" - they can be identified by anyone who wants to sit down and think about it.

But there are other markets and the likely introduction of a *crash'n'burn* type skiff into the Olympics (whether the 49er or some other skiff) opens up potential markets for the B14.

It is possible that the B14 could take the role the 420 has taken to the Olympic 470. However, that would mean some changes in market strategy.

Marketing can be defined as a process which takes a manufacturer's product and makes it ready for a customer to want to buy it. If we take that definition and the analogy of the 420/470 roles, then we have a number of market areas we should explore.

One of the these is the so-called "storm rig" used extensively in Japan. If this was given a better marketing image and name (e.g. The *Intermediate Rig* or *the Cadet* etc.) it could be marketed to the youth market.

At present this market is buying boats which last two years at the most. Imagine if we could provide this market with a skiff they can buy with a *Cadet* rig and they can compete both in their own division and in the open B14 class - yet which in two or three years time they can upgrade with a new set of sails (and a new forestay and a minor adjustment to the spinnaker pole) and sail the same hull as a full B14.


We know the B14 hull will last and be competitive and the value of the boat will be there when the boat is sold. So the real cost that is the cost for each time the boat is on the water is half or less than any comparable skiff. Don't you think parents would love not having to dig into their pockets every year or two for new boats.

The Sydney Flying Squadron is seeking a junior boat, the B14 Intermediate could be the answer to their needs.

Look at how Laser has marketed its various rigs, full, radial and 4.2 - they have seen that parents will buy the concept of upgrading a rig if the hull can continue to be sailed.

It is up to the Association, and that means you, to come up with the marketing approach and push the B14 - Starboard Products have never had a real marketing plan (and this is accepted by Julian Bethwaite - so it is not a revelation).

So let's get out there and Sell, Sell, Sell.

# Announcing the 1995/96 Australasian B14 Championships "PART OF SAIL MELBOURNE '96"

#### McCrae Yacht Club

Nepean Highway, McCrae, Victoria 27 - 31 December, 1995

#### The Venue

McCrae Yacht Club is the second home of B14 sailing in Victoria, with clear water, golden sand, good breezes, a convivial club atmosphere and some of the nicest beach views to be found on Port Phillip Bay.

The Club is experienced in hosting a wide range of sailing series and regattas, and is known as a good venue for events, with good quality event organisation and good sailing. The club is positioned adjacent to the Nepean Highway, in McCrae, offering easy access to the beach, as well as a grassed rigging area that is close to the beach.

#### The Sailing

McCrae Yacht Club offers some of the most exciting sailing on the bay, whether it be with pounding waves in a 40 degree northerly or the fast flat conditions offered by the 15 knot afternoon sea breeze.

The sailing program starts with an invitation race and the first heat on the 27th of December, and is followed over the next four days with morning or afternoon sailing sessions, allowing some extra time for exploring the Peninsula area.

#### The Area

The Mornington Peninsula area holds a feast of excitement for family and friends or for the spare time between races. The local vineyards (over 100 on the peninsula) provide a relaxing afternoon's entertainment after an early morning round of golf or a visit to the rose and herb gardens at Merricks North. The Arthur's seat chairlift provides scenic views and access to the Two Bays walking track to Dromana.

Local ferry and boat hire services provide interesting views of the bay and surrounds (and the racing), and also the opportunity to snorkel with the dolphins in the crystal clear waters. Parasailing is also available from the nearby Rye pier, while jet ski hire provides a way for getting some close view of the racing action (just don't get in my way - and don't bump the purple boat. It might break.). On the land there are many pleasant evening activities, including squash and sauna, ten pin bowling, mini golf or just visiting the local restaurants and bistros.

#### Accommodation

The Mornington peninsula is one of the most popular summer holiday destinations in Victoria, so booking accommodation early is encouraged. The McCrae Yacht Club have information on local accommodation and possibly billets, and this will be passed on as soon as it becomes available. In the mean time, the Dromana Tourist Information Centre (FREECALL 1800 804 009) can provide local accommodation contacts.

## CHANGES TO NEW SOUTH WALES BY-LAWS

The Board of Management passed a Notice on Motion at its last meeting which has the effect of more carefully defining the roles of the President, Vice-President, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer.
